

Be it further ordained by the Council that the recreation board shall be responsible for the direction, supervision, and promotion of such recreation programs as will contribute to the general welfare of the residents of the county or municipality, The board shall have control over all lands, buildings, equipment and other facilities assigned for recreational purposes to the board by the county or municipal governing body or purchased or leased by it from funds provided by the governing body. The Board shall cooperate with other local agencies and state and federal agencies for the purpose of maintaining and improving recreational services and facilities for the county or municipality. The Board shall have power to accept financial and other aid and grants from any public or private agency.

Be it further ordained that said board shall have all power, rights and duties set out in Sections 274 through 279 of Section 12 of the 1940 Code of Alabama as Recompiled.

ORDINANCE NO. 26

Councilman W. W. Foster introduced the following Ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE TO CALL A REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE , ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section One: That the regular municipal election in the town of Wilsonville, Alabama, shall be held on the second Tuesday in August, 1968, for the purpose of electing a Mayor and five members of the Council, and a second or "run-off" election shall be held on the first Tuesday after the second Monday in September, 1968, if necessary. The municipal officers elected shall assume the duties of their respective offices on the first Monday in October following such election and shall serve for a term of four years.

Section Two: That the voting places of said election shall be at the following places within the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama: City Hall.

Section Three: That the Mayor and Clerk be and they are hereby directed to give notice of said election at least forty days prior to the date of holding the same or before the third Tuesday in June preceeding the election by giving notice in a newspaper published within the City or by posting notice in three public places within the city, as provided by law; the publication of this ordinance will be sufficient notice of the calling of said election.

Section Four: That any person desiring to become a candidate at such election may become such a candidate by filing in the office of the Mayor a statement of candidacy accompanied by affidavit taken or certified by any officer authorized to take acknowledgments in this State; that such person is duly qualified to hold the office for which he desires to become a candidate. Such statement shall be filed by 5:00 o'clock p.m. on the first Tuesday in July, 1968, and shall be substantially in the following form:

I, the undersigned, being first duly sworn, depose and say that I am a citizen of the town of Wilsonville, in said County, and reside in said Town; that I desire to become a Candidate for the office of _____ in said Town for the term of four years at the election for such office to be held on the second Tuesday in August, 1968, being August 13, 1968; that I am duly qualified to hold said office if elected thereto and I hereby request that my name be printed upon the official ballot at said election.

Section Five: That the municipal governing body or a majority of them shall, not more than 20 nor less than 15 days before the holding of said election to hold said election as provided for in Section 7 of Act 663 of the 1961 Regular Session of the legislature of Alabama.

Section Six: That the Mayor shall and he is hereby directed to notify the election officials of their appointment and he is hereby directed to post a list of them in three public places within the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, and is directed to publish a list of them in some newspaper published in the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, if required by law, by one insertion, as provided by law.

Section Seven: That the polls shall be opened at eight o'clock in the morning and kept open without any intermission or adjournment until the hour of six o'clock in the afternoon, and no longer.

Section Eight: Be it further ordained that this Ordinance be published as required by law.

SECTION NINE: This Ordinance shall be entitled and shall be cited as "AN ORDINANCE TO CALL A REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, ON TUESDAY, AUGUST 13, 1968, WITH A "RUN-OFF" ELECTION, IF NECESSARY, TO BE HELD ON THE FIRST TUESDAY AFTER THE SECOND MONDAY IN SEPTEMBER, 1968, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING A MAYOR AND FIVE COUNCILLMEN."

Councilman introduced the following Ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 27

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE: For the purpose of this Ordinance the tax year shall be from October 1st of each calendar year to September 30th of each calendar year. On October 1st of each calendar year and for each year thereafter the personal and real property ad valorem taxes herein levied shall be based and due on State and County assessments for the preceding tax year and shall be due and delinquent at the same time when the State and County taxes for the preceding tax year are due and delinquent.

SECTION TWO: The Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, hereby enacts and adopts an ad valorem tax levy of 5 mills or $\frac{5}{100}$ of 1% which shall be assessed according to the Constitution and Laws of the State of Alabama against any and all personal and real property situated within the corporate limits of Wilsonville, Alabama, as assessed for State taxation as shown by the books for assessment for the State and County tax year ending the 30th day of September next preceding this tax levy; for the tax year 1967, and to continue from year to year thereafter unless modified or repealed.

SECTION THREE: The Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, hereby authorizes and directs the Tax Assessor and Tax Collector of Shelby County, Alabama to assess and collect its ad valorem taxes against any and all personal and real property situated within the corporate limits of Wilsonville, Alabama, as made and provided by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Alabama, and as provided in this Ordinance.
