The Wilsonville Town Council met Tuesday, September 04, 2018, in the Council Chamber Room at the Wilsonville Town Hall. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Lee McCarty at 6:32 P. M.

The meeting was opened with prayer by Councilman Larry Cohill.

Checks were examined by the council members immediately prior to the meeting. There was a question concerning a check for reimbursement of expenses for the Beautification Board. Mayor McCarty said there was some controversy about the lowering of the flags recently. Some were upset the flags were not lowered to honor Senator John McCain; however, we have to have a directive from the governor's office to do that. There was not one. The flags were lowered to honor former Mayor Frances Phelps. This was a decision that could be made locally.

A movie preview was shown concerning the Alabama Power ash lake in Wilsonville. The mayor appears in this movie which will be screened at the Altamont School in Birmingham, Thursday, September 13. This will be open to the public. It will also be screened in other places with dates to be announced. The firm was done by Southern Exposures – Alabama Rivers Alliance.

Mayor McCarty said the Shelby County Arts Council is beginning a fall series of events. He urged all to attend some of these events and support the Arts Council.

The Shelby County Sheriff's Office contacted the Town concerning the resolution appointing Deputy Bloom to be the enforcement officer for Ordinance Number 050802, Section 2. The ordinance, in Section 7, addresses assessment of costs. This section cannot be assigned to a deputy. The following resolution addresses the issue.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 180904

A RESOLUTION APPOINTING A REPRESENTATIVE PURSUANT TO THE TOWN OF WILSONVILLE ORDINANCE NUMBER 050802. SECTION 7

BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama as follows:

Section 7. ASSESSMENT OF COSTS

- (a) Upon completion of the work ordered by the Town Council, a designated representative shall compute the actual expense, including, but not limited to, total wages paid, value of the use of equipment, advertising expenses, postage, materials purchased, which were incurred by the Town of Wilsonville, Alabama, as a result of such work. An itemized statement of such expenses shall be mailed to the last known address of the owner, agent, occupant or lessee of the property.
- 2. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the Town Council.

2019 Budget

Sewer rates were addressed. There has not been an increase in rates since 2008. An increase is definitely needed. We are facing repairs of at least \$25,000.00 in FY2019. These repairs must be

done to meet ADEM regulations. There is a transfer of funds (\$32,480.00) from General Fund to Sewer in the proposed budget to cover that. From this point forward, the mayor recommends annual increases based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI). The rate increase will begin with October charges. The proposed figures are:

The Water Works budget was discussed. There are a lot of unknowns so budgeting was done conservatively. National Carbon Capture Center, next to E. C. Gaston Steam Plant, is closing; they have been a large use customer. Some testing is done every three years and those will be done in 2019, increasing the costs. There are some major repairs that need to be addressed, such as replacing old galvanized water lines on Spearman Street, McGowan Road, and Lilac Lane. Telemitry installation is almost complete, but some work remains to be done. The two old water tanks on Oakland Avenue need to be taken off line and removed; there will be engineering expenses involved in that project. The cost

of water we purchase from Columbiana, in ten years, has gone up from \$1.86 a gallon to \$2.24 a gallon and increases each year based on the Consumer Price Index.

Our water rates have not been increased since 2008. Roger Perry stated most systems are doing annual rate increases based on the Consumer Price Index. In his opinion, the annual increases are better than going up less often and the customer being hit with a large increase all at one time. The following increases were presented for consideration:
