

The Wilsonville Town Council met in regular session, Tuesday, January 22, 2019, in the Council Chamber Room at the Wilsonville Town Hall. Mayor Lee McCarty called the meeting to order at 6:30 P. M.

The meeting was opened with prayer by Councilman Blake Ray.

The following council members answered roll call: Richard Atchison, Larry Cohill, Gordon Fluker, Ivan Greene, Ricky Morris, Blake Ray, Melissa Rosetta.

The minutes of the January 08, 2019, regular council, which had been mailed to the council members before this meeting, were reviewed. #### Mayoral Announcements

The annual Safety Meeting/Dinner will be Tuesday, February 5, at the Old Town Grille in Childersburg.

On February 13<sup>th</sup>, the Shelby County Mayor's Meeting will be held. WIFI will be discussed at that time. February 21<sup>st</sup>, there will be a meeting with state legislators at which two issues will be topics of discussion: gasoline tax increase and broadband money to be released. There is a bill to be introduced at the upcoming legislative session which would ban even holding a cell phone while driving a vehicle.

The Shelby County Chamber of Commerce also has a day scheduled to meet with legislators.

February 4, the mayor will be meeting with The Kelley Group to discuss the Highway 25 sidewalk project.

Richard Atchison reported the platform and the stairs for the press box building at Helms Park have been constructed and ready to be galvanized. These items will be sent to Birmingham to be galvanized and then will be delivered here for installation. Marlin Gallups is to do the concrete work.
